- a picturesque venue where the medieval meets the modern.

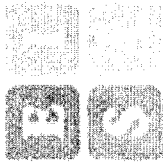

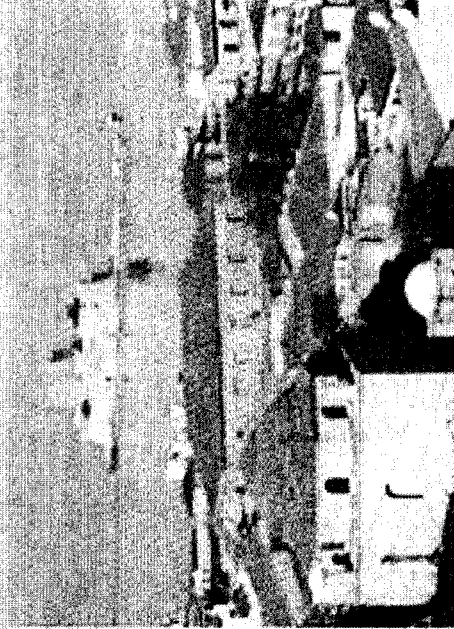
